- Follow software instructions for an unfamiliar spreadsheet application
- Interpret information from an insurance contract or a lease agreement
- Read reports of various parliamentary debates to learn about motives, values and intentions

- Write a formal letter to recommend a person for an apprenticeship
- Write a literature review to synthesize complex information from multiple sources
- Write a report to my client base on current industry trends, including facts and predictions
- Write a report on findings from a pilot project, including charts and graphs to present the data
