But I cannot understand when the vocabulary and structures are complex.</b></p>	<p><b>I can...</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Write a message to a colleague to cancel plans</li> <li>• Take notes in class to share with my classmate</li> <li>• Write an e-mail to ask for a refund for a product that did not work</li> <li>• Write two paragraphs to describe a familiar sequence of events</li> </ul> <p><b>I can write short communications on routine familiar topics, and am starting to develop some control of more complex grammar. But, I still make mistakes and use awkward word combinations. I don't always use the right type of language for the situation.</b></p>
